**Read the following text and answer the questions below**

**The Olympic Games**

The Ancient Olympic Games were held in Greece. It is believed that Heracles was the initiator of the games in honor of the Gods, especially Zeus. The legend says that it was Heracles who first called the Games "Olympic" and established the habit of organising them every four years.

5 Baron Pierre de Coubertin founded the *International Olympic Committee* (IOC) in 1894 and started the modern Olympic Games. The IOC is responsible for choosing the **host city** for each Olympic Games which is responsible for organising and funding a celebration of the Games. The celebration of the Games includes many rituals and symbols, such as the Olympic flag and torch, as well as the opening and closing ceremonies.

10 The evolution of the Olympic Movement during the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> centuries has resulted in several changes to the Olympic Games, for example the creation of the *Winter Games* for ice and winter sports, the *Paralympic Games* for athletes with a physical disability, and the *Youth Olympic Games* for teenage athletes. The IOC has also had to adapt to the varying economic, political, and technological realities of the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> centuries.

15 The Games were held every four years from 1924 until 1936, after which they were interrupted by World War II. The Olympics **resumed** in 1948 and were again organised every four years. Ever since, the Games have faced numerous challenges, including boycotts, doping and terrorism. But the good thing about the the Olympics is that they help unknown athletes to attain national, and in some cases, international fame. The Games also constitute a fantastic opportunity for the host city and country **to showcase** themselves to the world.
